FINANCIAL REPORT

Report of the Local Area Manager

Recommendation(s)

It is recommended that the Chandler's Ford and Hiltingbury (CFH) Local Area Committee allocate:

- (1) £1700 for five new dual waste bins at various locations in Chandlers Ford and Hiltingbury, funded from Developer Contributions;
 - (2) £500 to the Outreach Community radio station to go towards marketing costs, funded from the annual revenue budget that CFH has allocated for community grants;
 - (3) £500 for the provision of an outdoor classroom at Scantabout School, funded from the annual revenue budget that CFH has allocated for community grants;
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Summary

This report details a number of projects to improve the prosperity, environment and wellbeing of residents in the Chandlers Ford Area. The Local Area Committee's support is sought to enable their implementation.

Statutory Powers

Section 1 of the Localism Act 2011 i.e. the Local Authority's general power of competence, including power to act for the benefit of its area or persons resident or present in its area.
S.106 Town and Country Planning Act 1990

Strategic Implications

1. The works outlined below contribute to the following strategic priorities:
 - Local First: where possible taking decisions at a local level about things which affect people's lives, and using contributions from local developments for local projects
 - Excellent Environment for all: creating a sense of place through improved pathways, additional bins and air quality

- Enabling health and wellbeing and tackling deprivation; improving community infrastructure and places where different people can meet and receive support and services

Dual Waste Bins

2. The committee has an ongoing programme for extending the coverage of dual waste bins and replacing worn out bins to help reduce litter across the local area.
3. Five locations have been identified as having a need for a dual use bin which are as follows:
 - Oakmount Road - The lane at the back of 10-36 Oakmount Road/the island of land opposite the doctor's surgery car park.
 - Winchester Road - at the southbound bus stop near Springhill Road.
 - Hursley Road - near the path from Sutherlands Court, near the St Boniface Church car park.
 - In the area of Hocombe Road/Nichol Road.
 - Merdon Avenue - Triangular piece of land at Merdon Avenue where it breaks off into Tyrell Road.
4. It is recommended that the exact siting of the bins be agreed in consultation with the Boroughs Streetscene department.
5. A standard Broxap Derby 120 litre dual waste bin is used and supplied across the Borough. The total supply and cost of fitting for the litter bin is £340.
6. In order to fund the purchase of the 5 new dual waste bins it is recommended that the following Developer's Contribution is allocated for this purpose

Grant application for the Outreach Community radio station

7. The Chandlers Ford and Hiltingbury Local Area Committee has an annual budget of £2970 to allocate to community projects. Applications for grants can be made at any time.
8. The Outreach Community radio station are seeking a grant of £500 to help towards their marketing costs.

9. Relevant supporting documentation confirming suitability of the applicant, has been received with this grant application and has been successfully reviewed by officers.

Grant application for Scantabout School

10. The Scantabout Parent Teacher Association are seeking a grant of £500 for the provision of an outdoor classroom.
11. Relevant supporting documentation confirming suitability of the applicant, has been received with this grant application and has been successfully reviewed by officers.

Financial Assessment

12. There is no identifiable financial risks attached to this proposal as this Committee's budgets are sufficient to fund the recommendation.

Risk Assessment

13. There are no identifiable risks attached to these proposals which should be brought to the attention of the Local Area Committee and Council.
